Seems to be my biggest fears are happening now.

Narrative street artist **Dede Bandaid** and street poet **Nitzan Mintz** made their debut in Cleveland in 2022 by creating an impactful and visually significant project in collaboration with FRONT with "Culture Fix CLE": an installation consisting of fifty life-size photographs of prominent Cleveland artists installed in various locations around the city.

They will return to Cleveland with a new exhibition, "Art + Activism." In the aftermath of the October 7, 2023 massacre, Dede & Nitzan created an international activist campaign of

posters and oversized milk cartons imploring for the release of the hostages.

These works along with other iconic pieces will comprise the exhibition. "Art + Activism" will begin with a ten-day residency by the artists. During this time they will conduct artist tours of the exhibition, lead community-wide lectures on art and activism, and meet with students at Cleveland Hillel to discuss their feelings and response to university "encampments."






THE MONKEY HOUSE

Leaving his Orthodox upbringing behind, Amos Dov Silver is the creator of the drug-dealing mobile app "Telegrass." A polarizing figure for Israelis, he was revered by many, particularly soldiers suffering from PTSD, but as his business grew, so did accusations of corruption.



#BRING THEM HOME NOW

The 15' sculpture, bearing the faces of the 240 hostages taken on October 7, will remain on display through the end of 2024. Special thanks to the City of Beachwood for extending the permit. Designed by Nancy Schwartz-Katz and championed by Sharon Rosenbaum, the ribbon is currently surrounded by beautiful kalaniyot (anemones.) Andrea Litvin and a host of other community volunteers created and placed hundreds of the red flowers.

Kalaniyot grow across Israel and symbolize Israel's resilience, beauty, and heroism. They are said to bloom where a soul has fallen and signify hope, growth, and where the future begins. In the south of Israel, there is a festival of flowers each year - called Darom Adom where families picnic and celebrate nature and community. This festival was cancelled because of the war – but the kalaniyot still bloomed. And now they bloom in Cleveland as further evidence that the love of being Jewish will always exceed the hate we face.



The sculpture was made possible through the generous donation of Pam & Craig Kahn. The Kalaniyot Project was funded through an Israel at 75 grant.

Hitler's War on Modern Art October 30, 2024 – April 30, 2025

Under the control of the Nazi regime, works of art across Europe were confiscated in the



thousands. Some were destroyed; some were sold to help build their war machine; others were used as propaganda, promoting the idea that certain perspectives and people were 'degenerate' and 'unworthy of life'. This exhibition tells their story.

Featuring art from private and institutional collections, this exhibit explores the Third Reich's use of modern art as a tool of propaganda for public indoctrination to Nazi ideology and some of the artists, movements, events and outcomes of being branded 'degenerate'.


